



# Scholarships

## and other merit-based awards

### **Honored Scholar**

Ohio State Newark will award a number of scholarships (estimated to range from \$2,000 to \$4,000 for the academic year) to new students.

The criteria for competition includes having had a college preparatory curriculum completed at the high school level and having demonstrated strong academic performance evidenced by class rank, grade point average and standardized test scores. To qualify, students must either be in the top 10% of their class with an ACT of 26 or SAT score of 1180 or higher, or be in the top 5% of their class with an ACT score of 24 or 25 or SAT scores of at least 1110.

### **University Scholar**

Ohio State awards a number of University Scholarships (\$2,400 for the academic year) which are transferable to all campuses of Ohio State and are renewable for 4 years if renewal criteria are met. This award is open to students with demonstrated potential for high academic achievement, including all students who rank in the top 3% of their graduating class and achieve an ACT score of 29 or an SAT score of 1300 or above.

### **LeFevre Fellows**

Ohio State Newark will select a number of Honors students to be LeFevre Fellows. These students will receive a \$1,000 award to use for any school related expense. LeFevre Fellows are high-ability students who are active in the Honors Program and willing to devote 3 to 4 hours a week to community service. Additionally, they must take honors and community service courses. LeFevre Fellowship assignments include service to campus organizations, tutoring at local elementary schools, and internships with various community organizations.

### **National Merit/National Achievement Scholars**

This is open to National Merit Finalists and National Achievement Finalists who designate The Ohio State University as their first choice institution of attendance. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$2,000 with demonstrated financial need.

### **To Apply**

Unless otherwise indicated, new students should complete the Ohio State Newark admission application process. Priority will be given to those who apply by December 1, although consideration will be given to all who apply by March 1. Columbus campus applicants may request consideration for Newark campus awards by contacting the Office of Admissions at the phone numbers listed below.

More than one scholarship may be awarded to any one student, but the total dollar amount will not exceed the highest award. All information is subject to change. All awards are estimates and depend on funding.

# Honors Program

## *Eligibility*

Honored and University Scholars are automatically enrolled in the Honors Program.

All students can become Honors Eligible by earning a 3.4 grade point average after a minimum of 15 credit hours of non-remedial college courses. Students who are Honors eligible achieve Honors status by enrolling in one or more Honors courses.

## *Honors Courses*

Honors courses are small classes (15) with more student discussion and less lecture than in other courses. They usually require an independent research project, and students teach each other on the basis of their research. Honors courses are more informal than other courses, and students get to know the instructor very well.

Most years it is possible to fulfill the requirements for freshman composition, history, humanities, science and social science by taking Honors courses.

In addition, a one-credit hour Honors seminar is offered on a different topic every quarter.

## *Priority Scheduling*

Honors students are the first to be enrolled in their chosen courses.

## *Research Opportunities*

Honors students may be invited to assist faculty in their research. Some Honors students choose to write a Senior Honors Thesis and work with a professor on a research project of their choice.

## *OSU Newark Honors Society*

Honors students are invited to join this group which meets each quarter for membership meetings, fireside chats with faculty, and other events and activities.

## *Impressive College Record*

Honors students have an H on their transcript marking every Honors course they take. They can graduate with other distinctions which demonstrate high achievement to prospective graduate or professional schools or employers.

## *Honors Recognition*

In addition to fellowship and scholarship opportunities, outstanding student achievements are recognized each Spring at the Ohio State Newark Salute to Undergraduate Achievement.
